Light & Electricity

Reading

You should try to read for at least 20 minutes each day but we expect you to read at least 5 times a week and record this on your reading bookmark.



Try books, comics, newspapers like *First News* or other texts. Remember reading is part of everyday life - you could read out a recipe or instructions to a game!

If you read a book that you would like to recommend, you could complete a book review and share this with your class, year group or even the school.

Remember to bring in your reading bookmark every **Friday** for Mrs Jenkins and Miss Saunders to count up your reads to reward your Bronze, Silver and Gold reading awards.

Maths

In year 6, you need to know all your times tables up to 12×12 , including their related division facts. You can also use Numbots to practice your addition and subtraction facts.

Home Learning Project

- Create a project of your own choice related to light or electricity
