

Year 6 Spring 2 Curriculum

MATHS

In maths this term, we will be developing our understanding of statistics and learning how to read and present different types of data, including using pie charts and line graphs. We will be continuing to develop our problem solving and calculation strategies.

COMPUTING

In computing, we will be thinking about what a good website looks like and how we can efficiently navigate around a website due to its layout. We will then be having a go at creating our own website with what we have learnt.

RE

We will be looking at the concept of resurrection in the Easter Story and its significance to Christians.

ART

In art this term, we will be studying the work of the artist, Sonia Delaunay. We will be using collage to mimic her artistic style.

GUIDED READING

During Guided Reading this term, we are going to be focusing on different genres of texts including, a poem, a non-chronological report and a story to develop reading stamina and apply the skills we have learnt.

MUSIC

Year 6 will learn to play pieces without notation and from memory, just like jazz musicians do. They will be learning, playing and improvising to Bacharach Anorak.

ENGLISH

Our focus will be creative writing including setting description and narrative with dialogue. Our class reader 'The Explorer' will be the stimulus. We will continue to build up a portfolio of independent writing to support end of year 6 evidence for writing.

GEOGRAPHY

Our geography topic is called: 'Amazonia'. Throughout this topic we will be learning about the physical features of a rainforest, locations of rainforests around the world but of course focusing on the Amazon in particular. There will be a consideration of human impact (deforestation) on rainforests and a comparison between Amazonia and the New Forest will be considered.

This half term, we will be learning about human rights, including the right to education. We will also learn about prejudice and discrimination and begin to learn about how the government works.
