### Reading

*All children should be reading a minimum of 20 minutes per day, five times a week. Remember to bring in your reading log—every read counts!*

Explore different forms of literature — try magazines, graphic novels, picture or chapter books. Remember reading is part of everyday life - you could read out a recipe or instructions to a game!

If you read a book that you would like to recommend, you could complete a book review and share this with your class, year group or even the school. We will share some of these in our weekly focus.

Remember to bring in your reading log every **Friday** for Mrs Flynn and Mrs Jones to count up your reads to reward your Bronze, Silver and Gold reading awards.

### Maths

*By the end of Year 5 you should know all your times tables up to 12 x 12, including their related division facts.*

How quickly can you recall these? Can you identify all of the multiples in both ascending and descending order?

### Home learning project (Optional)

*How many irreversible or reversible changes happen every day in the home? Investigate your household appliances and see what you can discover! Can you bake a cake, watch what happens when you water your flowers, or even create some slime?! Bring your completed projects into school before the end of the half term so that they can be displayed and celebrated.*

This half term our topic is called 'Reversible and irreversible changes'.

This 'Reversible and irreversible changes' unit will teach the children about the properties of matter and describing how particles move. We will then look at reversible and irreversible changes.

To help support this learning you can create a home learning project that will be displayed and presented to the rest of the year group. You can choose to research;
