This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

#### Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

Music is taught in class every week and is informed by the Charanga music scheme Lessons are a minimum of 40 minutes and are taught by our music lead/ HLTA. Teaching is supported by specialist planning. This musical learning is further supplemented by weekly singing assemblies lasting 20 minutes led by SLT

Children in year 4 learn an instrument as a whole-class ensemble taught by music specialists from Hampshire Music Service (Listen to Me) as part of the Wider Opportunities programme. Each project lasts 10 weeks and culminates in a concert each term where children perform songs and pieces together for their parents.

## **Part B: Extra-curricular music**

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

At Calmore Junior School, we currently offer individual and small-group lessons on guitar, drums, cello, keyboard and brass through Hampshire Music Service. Teachers visit the school and teach children in our dedicated music room.

Individual and small group lessons are funded by parents, however for those children who are Pupil Premium, these lessons can be funded by the Pupil Premium provision. All ensembles are free and accessible to all of Key Stage 2.

We work closely with Hampshire Music Service to ensure we can offer the best possible music opportunities for our children. If you have an enquiry, regarding instrumental lessons on offer, please call the school office.

## Part C: Musical events

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.

Children will have the opportunity to perform or experience high quality music this academic year. Please see below for a list of those opportunities:

- All children from each year group perform on stage at the Christmas service at Testwood Baptist Church.
- Year 4 perform the annual Nativity each December
- Year 6 perform an end of year show each July
- Year 3 perform a singing and signing concert with year 1 from the Infant school
- All children perform on stage at the end of year celebration service at Testwood Baptist Church
- Children who learn an instrument have the opportunity to play with their music teacher during a special assembly each term
- All children watch M and M Theatre pantomime at Christmas
- All children watch M and M Theatre in June ( traditional story eg, the railway Children/ The secret Garden

## In the future

- Introduction of a wider range of instruments on offer for small group or individual lessons.
- Introduction of further whole-class ensemble projects delivered by a music specialist.
